Loch Frisa's famous white-tailed Eagles, Skye and Frisa stay around all year

In addition to Skye and Frisa, there is a whole host of other wildlife including - golden eagle, hen harrier, divers and lots more!

- Ranger led trips run Monday to Friday, twice daily at 10:00 and 13:00 – each trip lasts for 2 hours
- The meeting point is just off the A848 Tobermory to Salen Road about 700 metres north of the main Forestry Commission buildings. The turnoff is signposted and we meet in the car park about 1km along the track. You'll drive right up to the hide, in your own car, guided by the ranger.
- £5.00 for adults, £2.00 for under 16's. Please pay the ranger on the day by cash or cheque. Sorry, we don't have a card machine. If you live on Mull, it's free but all donations appreciated.
- Money raised from trips to the Hide helps the Mull & Iona Community Trust protect Mull's wildlife through Mull Eagle Watch and it also goes to numerous local good causes on Mull & Iona.
- Booking is advisable and should be made through the VisitScotland office at Craignure on 01680 812556.
